Dr. Varagona is an Assistant Professor at Kennesaw State University WellStar School of Nursing. She holds a BSN in Nursing from the University of Florida, an MSN in Psychiatric-Mental Health Nursing from Yale University, a PhD in Community/Organizational Psychology from Georgia State University, and an Executive MBA from Emory University. Dr. Varagona is a Board Certified Advanced Practice Nurse, a licensed Psychologist, a certified Spiritual Director, and a member of Sigma Theta Tau International Honor Society of Nursing, Psi Chi National Honor Society in Psychology, and the International Honor Society of Beta Gamma Sigma. Her research consists of creating healthcare work environments that positively impact quality of care, patient outcomes, and cost of quality care.



Christopher Martorella, MSN, RN, NEA-BC

Christopher Martorella is a skilled healthcare leader with more than 25 years of experience in nursing leadership, clinical operations, and patient services. He has been responsible for strategic planning, operational budgeting, business development, and clinical oversight in a variety of healthcare settings including a 286-bed community hospital, a 764-bed teaching facility with level II trauma care, and a 600-bed, Magnet-accredited academic medical center.

Prior to joining Compass Clinical Consulting, Christopher served in full-time, interim, and consulting roles. He was the Interim Nursing Director at Parrish Medical Center in Titusville, FL, where he served as change agent for the refinement of a new medical/surgical services model; rapidly assessed units to identify strengths, gaps, and opportunities for improvement; and developed and implemented plans to improve and sustain positive clinical outcomes and cost structures. He also served in a full-time capacity as Vice President of Patient Services, Chief Nursing, and Director of Nursing. In these roles, he developed action plans to grow Rehabilitation and Obstetrical business and developed proposals aimed at reducing overtime and contract staff including float pool, sign-on bonus and non-benefit full time positions; increased patient satisfaction by implementing leader and hourly staff rounding and discharge phone calls; developed business plans for the nursing department; and collaborated to develop a variety of reporting systems for a nursing dashboard.

Christopher also spent four years as a Senior Manager with Quorum Health Resources, where he served as a consultant and project manager for a range of engagements including nursing and other clinical departmental operational assessments, mock accreditation surveys and accreditation recovery, workforce efficiency and strategy engagements, patient throughput engagements, and educational engagements for nursing leaders.

Christopher is currently pursuing his Doctor of Nursing Practice from the University of Central Florida. He holds a Master of Science in Nursing with a focus on critical care and administration from the University of Florida and a Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Florida State University. Christopher also participated in the Johnson & Johnson/Wharton Fellowship in Management for Nurse Executives at the University of Pennsylvania. He is a Registered Nurse and is LEAN Certified. He is a member of the American Organization of Nursing Executives, where he serves as a Regional Director, and is on the Regional Planning Board for the American Hospital Association. Christopher is also an adjunct faculty member at the University of Central Florida, where he works with students in a capstone practicum experience leading to a master's degree in nursing leadership and management.



Virginia Pesata, DNP, ARNP, NEA-BC, FNAP

Dr. Pesata is the DNP Program Director at South University and is a Research Scholar at the University of Florida. She has worked as a Pediatric Nurse Practitioner, administration, research and higher education. She received a Doctor of Nursing Practice degree from George Washington University and Master of Nursing degrees as both a Family Nurse Practitioner and Pediatric Nurse Practitioner. Her research studies include leadership, administration, health literacy and the integration of arts in hospital settings. She is a Fellow of the National Academies of Practice and a Clinton Global Initiative individual student member.



Willie C. Roberts, MSHA, BSN, RN, FCN

Ms. Willie Roberts a Florida native, career as a health care advocate began forty four years ago as a licensed practical nurse and progressed to registered nurse. She received her BSN and Masters Science in Health Administration with a minor in Community Health from the University of North Florida. She has held leadership positions in varied health care arenas to presently include, St. Vincent's HealthCare where she coordinates several community outreach ministries; Faith Community Nursing(FCN) and Brighter Beginnings whose primary goals are to positively impact major health disparities plaguing the poor and underserved. During the past five years with St. Vincent's Ms. Roberts has established partnerships with 192 Faith Communities comprising 18 denominations in 5 counties promoting healthy lifestyle behaviors while providing education sessions and free health fair screenings. Annually, she provides FCN Foundation Curriculum Course Training for RN equipping them to either enhance or establish a health ministry in individual church. She produce quarterly newsletter and provide CEU for faith nurse partners.

Shands Hospital where she initiated a federal funded program in 1989 for high risk obstetric patients with HIV. This was the very first federal funded program in the State of Florida to test pregnant women for the HIV virus. She also started the first support group for women with HIV in the five county areas, which continues to function today. Ms. Roberts for twenty two years in the Department of Community Relations and Education at Shands Hospital where she served as Nurse Case Manager/Supervisor for the inpatient/emergency department Ryan White Part A Program. With an eye on Health Care Disparities and Healthy People 2010, Ms. Roberts organized and teaches a class on nutrition, weight control, and

exercise; she organizes and coordinates 4 workshops per year on breast and cervical cancer awareness; she organized the HIV/AIDS Christian Women Coalition to address the holistic approach to women living with HIV-AIDS and to provide community awareness education and testing, and has also driven the mobile unit to provide health fairs to remote communities in North Florida and South Georgia; and assist faith-based organizations to establish health ministries and testing sites. Ms. Roberts is an effective change agent in her community.

Her responsibilities have included a 2016 trip to Chicago FCN Westberg 30th Anniversary Conference, where she delivered a poster presentation addressing "FCN Initiative Combatting Sudden Infant Death Syndrome in Duval County, Jacksonville,," in 2008 traveled under the Georgetown University and ANAC partnership Nurses SOAR mentorship project to Durban, South Africa for 6 weeks and 2011 a 7 days mission trip to Haiti. She has also written articles for ONYX magazine on the HIV virus in the African-American community and SLR's Living Today on Nursing, a Profession of "Resilience" Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow. Ms. Roberts has received numerous prestigious recognitions and awards most recent Health Source Magazine, Nurse Legacy Finalist and 2015 Association of Nurses in AIDS Care (ANAC) President Award. Ms. Roberts today continue to provide strong advocacy for persons indigent, uninsured and underserved and those living with HIV/AIDS, through serving on numerous community and national committees.



Connie King, MA - Consultant/Counselor in Leadership Development

Connie has a rich history in education, corrections and the legal system. Her career spans over a decade of working with people whose lives have been effected by "the system." She has a master's degree in counseling specializing in consulting, school guidance, special populations and substance abuse. As prevention counselor with the Department of Corrections, she prepares women prisoners for re-entry into the community. The curriculum focuses on errors in thinking and behavior management. While working as a judicial assistant with the Florida state courts, the judge's docket included juvenile delinguency and dependency cases; as a guidance counselor she helped adult students mainstream back into the educational/vocational system; as Teen Court Coordinator she managed the intervention of youthful offenders and provided them an alternative to the criminal justice system; as mentoring coordinator for a child intervention/prevention group she found mentors for children of incarcerated parents; as education manager for Head Start she served as leadership chair of the school readiness leadership team, promoted the idea of parents as their child's first and best teacher, and trained staff on how to collaborate efforts to develop resources for children and families. Connie is a certified Dependency court mediator. She is the objective presence at the table with the parent, court system, and state agency. An engaging presenter and dynamic speaker, her unique training style keeps the listener engaged from beginning to end. She speaks to the heart and seeks to meet others where they are in their personal and professional life. Principal and founder of Erimar Consulting, training curriculum is tailored to put the human back in resources. The mother of two, Connie enjoys spending time with her grandson and says, "he is the best part of my day."
